Early Childhood Education

Kids Can serves children ages 6-weeks to 5-years old in our Early Childhood Education program. In existence for nearly a century, our state-licensed program utilizes Creative Curriculum as the core teaching component.

We are an active participant in Step Up To Quality, a program through the Nebraska Department of Education and Health & Human Services that helps families identify early childhood providers who demonstrate a commitment to quality care. Kids Can was awarded a Step 5 status and is one of only three centers in Omaha at this highest achievable level.

In the 2022-2023 school year, 102 children attended our early childhood program, open every weekday from 6:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Using research-based curriculum and learning-throughplay, we strive for all children to reach their potential.

Last year, 98% of students were physically ready, 83% were socially and emotionally ready, and 82% were academically ready for Kindergarten.





Out Of School Experiences

Kids Can served 1,039 children in our Out-of-School programs. Our center site offers the widest variety of programs including before and after school with transportation to nearby schools, plus full day programming when school is closed for holidays/in-service days. We also provide a full-day summer program at our center in South Omaha and Miller Park in North Omaha.



Kids Can partners with Collective For Youth, schools, and foundations to provide on-site after school programs at Gilder, Miller Park, Minne Lusa, Wakonda, Conestoga Magnet, Benson West, and Nelson Mandela Elementary. We are excited to announce Druid Hill Elementary as our newest location for the 2023-24 school year. Our goal is for every student to improve their social skills, demonstrate curiosity and future focus, develop positive behaviors, and engage in our STEMsmart Academy (science, technology, engineering, mathematics, strength, music, art, reading, tutoring).

Last year, 78% reported developing a future focus-growth mindset, 74% reported positive peer relationships, and 84% reported experiencing an adult who cares.





Mentoring At Kids Can

Mentoring is back! This program that took the biggest hit during the pandemic as we focused on the health and safety of our children, staff, and volunteers. We are proud to say that mentoring is back and better than ever!

The program takes place on-site right after school with the goal to build strong, successful relationships through 1-on-1 activities. Matches work together to decide if they want to bake, build an obstacle course in the gym, play games, or get creative doing arts and crafts. In only 4 hours a month, you'll make a huge difference engaging confident, and inspired kids!
